

Scientific Inquiry Experiments

Mrs. Cowherd's class had a great time learning about scientific inquiry. As we were learning about the steps, we had to practice them. We chose to do it by observing the diet coke and mentos experiment on Youtube. This caused us to have many questions. Some of them were, "I wonder if the same reaction would happen with different types of pop?" "I wonder if the type of mentos would make a different reaction?" After narrowing our guestions down to these two, we made our hypotheses. Then we set up our experiments and discussed what a "control" is in an experiment. Next was the fun part...performing the experiments. Finally, we drew some conclusions from our experiments. We concluded that it was the nucleation on the mentos that causes the reaction, and that caffeine in the pop does NOT cause the reaction. Those observations led us to new questions which would have started the whole process over again.

In the past four decades, obesity rates in the United States have soared among all age groups. This rise in obesity rates has affected our youth in alarming fashion. Childhood obesity has increased more than fourfold among those ages 6 to 11. Over 23 million children and teenagers in the United States ages 2 to 19 are obese or overweight, a statistic that health and medical experts consider an epidemic. On March 26, 2010, a resolution was unanimously passed in the Senate to designate September 2010 as a "National Childhood Obesity Awareness Month," bringing national attention to a growing epidemic among youth in the United States. Here are Coal City Unit District #1, the Physical Education and Heath Departments are doing

their part too. Throughout the year, the students get assessed on their body fat percentage as well as their fitness level in five categories according to the National Presidential Fitness Program: cardiovascular endurance, agility, flexibility, upper body strength, and abdominal strength. Each student then receives a report informing them of their overall health strengths and weaknesses. It provides them with information of how to improve in each area, and the areas of potential future health diseases if they are at risk.

The five categories are then assessed daily in the Physical Education department in some form of fitness. Physical fitness activities include: yoga, pilates, step aerobics, dance, circuits, interval training, strength training, kickboxing, daily core routines, races, and many other fun activities. The upcoming month of October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Throughout the last week of October, students will be encouraged to support Breast Cancer Awareness by wearing pink to their Physical Education and Fit for Life classes each day. During classes, important statistics and preventative measures will also be discussed.



Fitness Stars!

The Physical Education Department is finishing up their 1st round of fitness testing at the high school. Throughout the year the students get assessed on their body fat percentage as well as their fitness level in 5 categories according to the National Presidential Fitness Program. The first test was the mile, to measure cardiovascular endurance; the second was the shuttle run, to measure agility; the third was the sit and reach, to measure flex-ibility; the fourth was push-ups, to measure upper body strength; and the last test was sit-ups, to measure abdominal strength. In order to receive the Presidential award students had to of tested in the top 85th percentile of teenagers in the nation in all 5 areas. This is the highest award given.
